RULES & REGULATIONS - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. All showing of horses and ponies will take place **indoors**. ENTRIES FOR CLASSES 2-3, inclusive, Horse & Pony Classes, **close 9:30 am**, Sunday, July 19, 2009. Horse show starts **10:00 am**, Sunday, July 19, 2009. FOR ADVANCED ENTRIES AND INQUIRIES - Phone: Mark Law, 743-2049. In all Horse & Pony Classes, entry fee of **\$2.50** per section entered shall be paid at time of registering entries. **ALL** horse cheques will be mailed out **AFTER** the fair. **Please ensure mailing address is complete with phone number – Ag. Society will not be responsible for lost or non-delivery of cheques. A deposit of \$2.00/day for use of stalls - if cleaned out prior to leaving - deposit will be returned.**

ENTRIES for CLASSES 14-35 must be **IN PLACE** to be judged by **9:30 am**, Saturday, July 18, 2009. **Entries may be brought in FRIDAY, July 17, 2009, 6:00 p.m-7:30 pm SHARP.** ALL EXHIBITS IN THESE CLASSES MUST REMAIN IN PLACE UNTIL **4:00 pm**, Sunday, July 19, 2009 under penalty of forfeiting any prize awarded.

2. **CYPRESS RIVER FAIR TAGS ONLY OR BE DISQUALIFIED.**

3. **ONE ENTRY PER SECTION PER PERSON OR BOTH ARTICLES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

4. Any Exhibitor may show as many articles as he or she wishes on one entry fee of **\$5.00**. No persons who have not paid an entry fee, except Junior Exhibitors (See Note Below), shall be allowed to exhibit. ***NOTE:** A **\$2.00** entry fee is required for Junior Exhibitors, **age 16 & under**, entering only in Classes for Junior Exhibitors, but if a Junior Exhibitor enters Class(es) that are open to anyone, a entry fee of **\$5.00** is required. **ENTRY FEE IS FREE ADMISSION FOR THAT MEMBER ONLY TO GROUNDS ON FAIR DAYS. \$1.00 MEMBERSHIP MAY BE PURCHASED AT ANY TIME.**

5. In all other classes, the Society shall retain 10% of all prize monies \$5.00 and over, (**EXCEPT SPECIALS**), earned by each Exhibitor. **Prizes under \$20.00** will be paid out in cash and a signature will be required. **PRIZES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.**

6. Exhibitors for Classes 14-35, are requested to send entries to Linda Truelove **prior** to Fair dates, Ph: 743-2113. All entries must be on paper and **delivered** or **mailed** to Linda Truelove, Box 72, Cypress River, Mb, R0K 0P0. Exhibitors for Classes 2-3 are requested to send entries to Mark Law, Box 5, Cypress River, Mb, R0K 0P0, Phone: 743-2049.

7. All exhibits must be the Exhibitor's **PROPERTY OR PRODUCED ON ONE'S FARM OR HOLDING**: all Exhibits in Classes 14-35 must be the work of the Exhibitor and all exhibits **MUST HAVE BEEN COMPLETED IN THE PREVIOUS 12 MONTHS.**

8. All EXHIBITS with the exception of horses/ponies, and houseplants, **MUST NOT HAVE BEEN EXHIBITED** at a Cypress River Fair in **ANY PREVIOUS YEAR.**

9. In Sections where a definite number of articles is asked for, all Exhibits must contain the exact number specified, or automatically be disqualified.

10. All Exhibitors shall be **PERSONALLY** responsible for setting up and removing their exhibit items.

11. Only one prize will be allowed to any Exhibitor in any one Section in any Class, except horses/ponies classes. ***SEE SPECIAL RULING IN HORSE & PONY CLASSES.**

12. **NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO INTERFERE WITH THE JUDGES WHILE IN CHARGE OF THEIR DUTIES.** Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit their right to any premiums to which they might otherwise be entitled. In the event that an Exhibitor acts in an abusive manner towards a Judge or a Director he/she shall be asked to leave the grounds immediately.

13. Judges' decisions shall be final, unless appealed as herein-after provided. Every grievance, complaint, and protest must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary and shall be accompanied by a \$10.00 grievance fee for each appeal in question, which will be returned to the complainant if the appeal is sustained. **(*NOTE:**

FOR HORSES/PONIES CLASSES GRIEVANCES MUST BE MADE WHILE JUDGES ARE STILL ON THE GROUNDS).

14. In the absence of competition, the Judges may award First, Second, Third, or NO prize, according to the merit of the exhibit and shall have in their power to withhold any premium for any animal or article which they consider unworthy of same, or prize money may be reduced to 75%.

15. Placings are to be indicated by the Judges at the conclusion of judging of each Section of each Class.

16. Articles on exhibit shall not be handled except by the Directors and Judge of the Department to which they belong.

17. **The Society RESERVES THE RIGHT TO LIMIT THE TOTAL PRIZE LIST to an amount equal to the net receipts. In the event of net receipts being insufficient to allow the prize list to be paid in full, each prize will be prorated accordingly, and all the entries are made and received in this distinct understanding. This regulation applies to every class of entry.**

18. The Society shall not be responsible for any damage to or loss of any exhibit; however, the Society will take reasonable precautions to prevent damage or loss. Exhibitors and spectators shall participate at their own discretion.

19. Exhibitors will please communicate any complaint or grievance, in writing, mailed to the Society, Box 194, repayments of prize money to the Treasurer within 10 days of the receipt of prize money.

20. All cheques MUST be cashed within 60 days of the receipt. ****NOTE: ANY EXHIBITOR ISSUING A NSF CHEQUE WILL BE CHARGED \$10.00 OVER AND ABOVE THE NSF CHARGE OF THE BANKING INSTITUTION.**

21. Any infringement of the Rules will be punished by withdrawing the prizes, expulsion from the Society, or both.

22. Directors reserve the right to place an exhibit in a more appropriate Class or make a new Class.

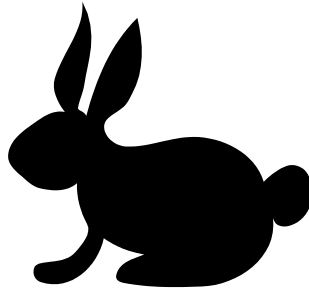

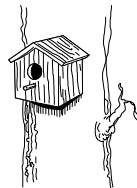

HINTS TO EXHIBITORS:

Vegetables on exhibit should be uniform in size and shape, according to their respective variety. May be washed to remove dirt, or rub gently with a soft brush or cloth. Multiplier onions are not to be completely separated but spread apart gently to reveal whole cluster. Cut all tops off all onion varieties evenly to leave approximately 8-10 cm (3"-4") of top. Trim onion roots. Trim tops of beets, carrots, turnips, to 4-5 cm (2"). Garden Corn: show whole plant including root (side shoots detract from the exhibit). Collection: must be neatly and attractively arranged and labelled neatly.
